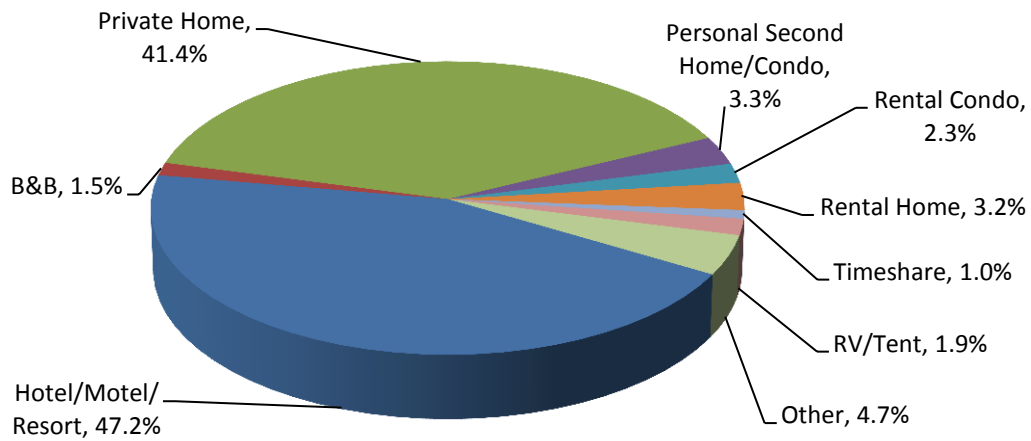

- Approximately 82.7% of *overnight* visitors to North Carolina reported that they were visiting for leisure purposes. Business travelers accounted for 15.3% of overnight visitors in 2011. Business includes meetings and conventions. Approximately 2% reported “other purpose of trip” to North Carolina.

Overnight Visitor Lodging



- Eighty four percent of *overnight* visitors came by auto/RV or other auto to North Carolina. Twelve percent came by plane.
- The average party size of a 2012 NC overnight visitor party was 1.9 persons. Approximately 23% of parties included children in their visits to North Carolina, while 77% did not.

- The average age of the 2012 NC visitor is 47 years and 57% are married.
- Nearly 86% classify themselves as white and just over 10% as black/African American.
- Over 34% of NC overnight visitors have annual household income in excess of \$85,000; 25% have a reported annual household income of over \$100,000.
